Be Merciful Like the Father

Celebrating the Jubilee Year of Mercy

This week's gospel calls us to repent and to feast. The parable of "The Forgiving Father" is probably one of the most familiar passages to us. We know the characters well – the younger son who runs away from home, squanders his inheritance, ends up hungry and taking care of pigs and then decides to return home – the jealous older brother angry at his brother's return and envious of the attention given him – and, of course, the breathtaking patient and persistent love of the Father waiting for the return of His lost son and then embracing him and celebrating with a joyous feast.

In the beginning of the gospel today, the scene is set for Jesus to tell this parable. We find the Pharisees and scribes complaining that Jesus welcomes tax collectors and sinners and even eats with them. They are the outcasts, the ones who "don't count," who are moved to the fringes of the outer circle of life. In the parable today, both sons, in their own way, felt as though they "don't count," are unimportant, unappreciated, or foolish. Can you imagine that when, half-heartedly sorry for the foolishness of our sins, we tell God that we come back to him, and that He then embraces us with love and mercy and prepares a feast for us? It is almost like a hero's welcome – parade and all!! A God lavish with love, mercy, and forgiveness waits for us and welcomes us home over and over again. God never tires of waiting and embracing us in His mercy. As unconditional as God's love is for us, He asks that we do the same for each other – to never tire of reaching out in love and forgiveness.

Do we have someone in our lives – in our family, neighborhood, workplace, community, etc. who "doesn't count" in our life? Can we find small ways to open our hearts and minds to forgive, to embrace, and to welcome that person once again into the circle of our life? This Lent let us look at the example of the "Forgiving Father" and reflect and learn from Him. Has he ever stopped forgiving us or being patient with us? This is what we can learn from God, Our Father, no matter how difficult it may be. In this special time of grace and mercy, COME, let us together join in the feast of forgiveness.

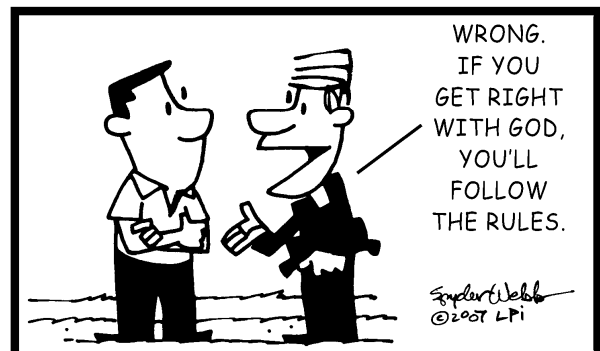
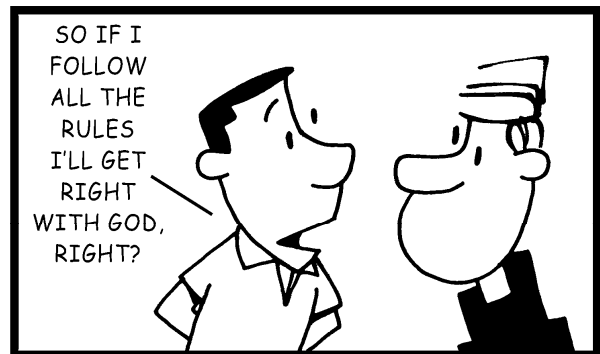
